Topic: “Challenges for Japan and Germany: Intelligent Networks and Smart Grid; Information Technologies: Cyber Security & Information Security”

The pace of development of the technically feasible has rapidly accelerated over the past years; *Information Security* and *Cyber Security* are only two keywords which increasingly came into public focus in Japan, Germany and even worldwide. Especially the usage of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV), better known as drones, is being discussed in this context. Both themes have yet unresolved but highly relevant issues of privacy protection and data security in common.

Our speaker will outline possible ways of dealing with these challenges: There are still no clear laws that define the frames within which we can use these new technologies and intensive work is necessary to develop the relevant standards, codes and other regulations. He will share his insights into the efforts Germany and Japan are making to solve the technical safety issues and face the socio-political challenges. He will also outline which effects this progress might have on future economic developments in both markets.



Speaker: Prof. Dr. h.c. Ralf Wilde, Ph.D., Member of the Board, TÜV Rheinland Berlin Brandenburg Pfalz e.V.

Prof. Wilde has a degree in automation engineering and completed his doctorate in 2009. He has been working for TÜV Rheinland in various positions since 1982. From 1986 to 2010, as President and CEO of TÜV Rheinland in Japan, he was responsible for developing TÜV’s Asian business as provider of testing services. Upon returning to Germany, he was appointed to the Board of Management in December 2011.
